Dear Mr. Winuk:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act<sup>1</sup> (the "Act"). As you are aware, on August 13, 2020, the Enforcement Division informed your client that we were considering initiating an investigation regarding a possible violation of the Act's campaign disclosure provisions. Based on a review of the complaint and the information provided, the Enforcement Division will not pursue an enforcement action in this matter.

You have since explained that most of the expenditures identified in the complaint are related to Mr. Tanaka's officeholder duties as a Councilmember of Palo Alto. The expenditures were related to constituent outreach challenges in response to the pandemic. However, one of the alleged expenditures to Google for \$67.46 for canvassing costs was mislabeled. Since the expense was under \$100 which does not require itemization on the campaign statement under Section 84211(k) of the Act, we will not pursue this matter further.
